

Dear Friends,

The Israelites are stuck between a rock and a hard place – actually, between the Red Sea and the army of Egypt. You remember the story. Through a series of plagues, God convinces Pharaoh to let the Israelites go. The hard heart of Pharoah was finally broken. The people of Egypt were glad to see God's people leave. The plagues were devastating.

The newly freed people are stuck facing the Red Sea and the immanent attack of the Egyptian army, who changed their minds. They are barricading the Israelites against the sea with 600 chariots. The Israelites react in fear and panic. Yelling at

Moses, "Was it because there are no graves in the wilderness? Why did you bring us out of Egypt just to die?" In essence, they say we want to go back and serve the Egyptians.

Moses preaches a sermon. "Do not be afraid, stand firm, and see the deliverance that the Lord will accomplish for you today; for the Egyptians whom you see today you shall never see again. The Lord will fight for you, and you have only to keep still." (Exodus 14:13-14)

Stop complaining and start remembering everything God has done for you. God is bigger than this Egyptian army. God, who is present in a cloud of smoke, moves to the back of the people and blocks the army. Once Moses raises his arms, God drives back the sea waters, creating a safe passage to the other side. God even dries the sea bottom, so they cross on dry ground. The Egyptians are not given safe passage.

In verse 15, God tells the people to go forward. I wonder if this is a two-step process. One – be still. Two – go forward. We cannot go forward until we are still. Quiet ourselves before God. Hush our complaining. Silence our plans to secure our lives.

We all were taught from a young age to work hard, do good things, and help others. If we are responsible, we are good daughters and good sons. We grow up solving problems, fixing broken things, and being responsible adults. Work, work, work. Busy, busy, busy.

Moses' sermon at the Red Sea teaches us an important lesson. The Christian faith is not about being busy for the Lord but being still. We can get so busy doing church things we forget to be quiet and listen to God. Quiet our busy abilities to let God do something amazing. How often do we panic at being between a rock and a hard place? Life is often overwhelming. Listen to God say to you, "Be still."

Praying Psalm 46:10 can assist us in slowing down, quieting our busy minds, and finding stillness before God.

- Bags (2 or 4 lb.) granulated sugar
- Hamburger Helper, Tuna Helper & Chicken Helper—(Tuna & Chicken preferred)
- Chunky or Progresso soups, all kinds
- Canned Sloppy Joe sauce
- Canned Vegetables: Carrots, Chili Beans, Lima Beans, Blacked Eyed Peas, Kidney Beans, Greens (Spinach, Turnip, Collard)




