



Dear Friends,

All of us have asked our parents "Why?" Why can't I stay out later? Why can't I skip school just this once? Why do I have to go to church? A man was sitting watching television on Sunday morning. His wife came into the room and told him he should get ready for church, or he would be late. He told her he didn't want to go. She pushed him a second time. "No, I don't like church." "What do you mean," she asked? He responded, "I don't want to go to church. No one likes me and I don't like them." She responded, "you have to go!" "Give me one good reason why I should go to church." "Well, for one thing, you are the pastor."

Psalm 100 tells us why we should go to church and why we should praise God. It is a beautiful song commanding us to sing and make music to God. "Make a joyful noise to the Lord; worship the Lord with gladness; come into his presence with singing and thanksgiving." Verse 3 and 5 answer the question why. The Lord is God, and the Lord is good. "Know that the Lord is God. It is he who made us, and we are his; we are his people, and the sheep of his pasture." And "The Lord is good; his steadfast love endures forever and his faithfulness to all generations."

The motivation to worship the Lord is because he is God. The Lord is over all gods and all powers. God is Creator of the world and everything in it, including us. God created you and me. The Lord is also good. God defines goodness. The goodness we see around us in creation is all God's doing. John Calvin said, "Creation is the theater of God's glory." Furthermore, the Lord's love is steadfast and never runs out. In God, we have an endless supply of goodness and love. We worship God with gladness and joy because his faithfulness also never runs out. There is enough faithfulness for our kids, grandkids, their kids, and their grandkids. God's love and faithfulness are forever.

Psalm 100 summons us to offer ourselves to God, knowing we do not own ourselves. "It is he who made us, and we are his; we are his people, and the sheep of his pasture." Everything we are and everything we have belongs to God. If we belong to God, so do our possessions. Our money, our homes, cars, and boats; all our stuff in our homes. Our confession to follow Jesus Christ as our Savior and Lord transfers ownership and everything we have is seen as a gift from God's goodness.

Many families, along with my own, grew up with the mealtime prayer, "God is great, good is good. Let us thank him for our food. By his hands we all are fed. Give us Lord our daily bread."

May we begin each day and every meal with thanksgiving and praise.

HOLIDAY SEASON UPDATE! As the Holiday Season has ended, the Missions Committee wanted to provide an update on a beautiful giving season by the Congregation. As Community Child Care is a main church mission project, during the month of November, food/money was collected from the Congregation which filled 25 Thanksgiving food baskets for those families (from Community Child Care) in need. Immediately after Thanksgiving, gifts/money were collected for 50 children (from 40 families) from Community Child Care. Also, a children's book (depicting the meaning of Christmas) was purchased for each of the 40 families. A \$25 gift card was also purchased and given to each staff member at the child care center. Christmas food



baskets were also given to 5 families at Lakeside Park Elementary School, along with a Walmart \$25 gift card for each of these families. Also, the Missions quilting group made 50 quilts which were distributed to various nursing homes in the area.

There are lots of opinions about these topics.






